Dear Friends and Colleagues,

It's my pleasure to add my congratulations to Nguyen Anh Tuan on his selection as VTV Person of the Year for 2018.

When the Boston Global Forum (BGF) was established, it was my hope that it would become a major venue for the exchange of ideas about pressing international developments. That hope has been realized beyond what I had imagined and there is one person in particular who deserves the most credit for that accomplishment – Nguyen Anh Tuan.
